



<input type="radio" name="PickOne" value="yes">yes <input type="radio" name="PickOne" value="no">no	Radio (select one) <input checked="" type="radio"/> yes <input type="radio"/> no

Beyond placing data elements in rows `<tr>` and columns `<td>`, we can specify table format details through additional formatting in table attributes such as background color
`<td bgcolor="pink">` or row height `<tr height="50">`
