

## Programs

On lab/linux machines:

**Browser:** Firefox, Chrome

**Editor:** gedit

**Directory browser:** Files

On Windows

**Browser:** Firefox, Chrome, Explorer

**Editor:** Notepad

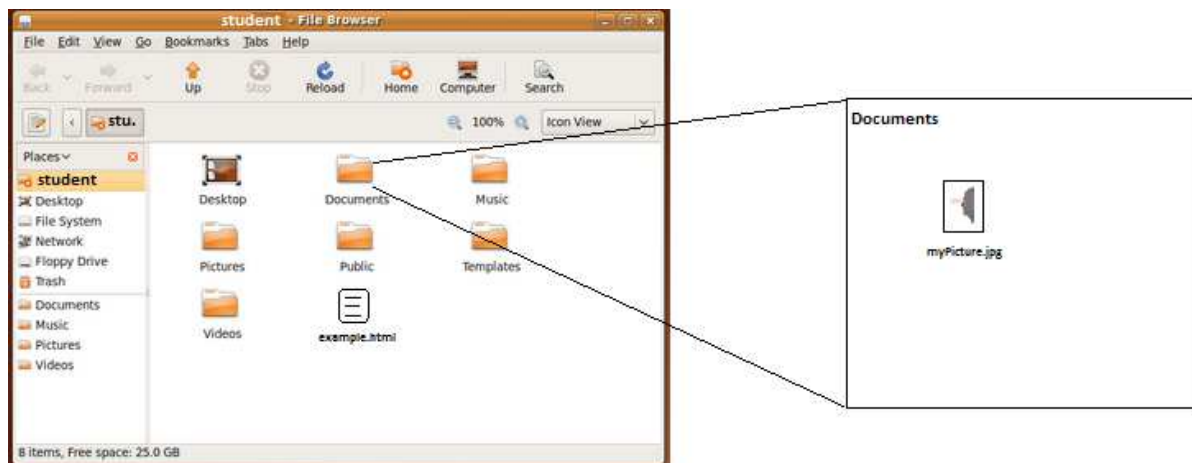
On Mac

**Browser:** Firefox, Chrome, Explorer, Safari

**Editor:** TextEdit – Before you save your file, you must select “**Make Plain Text**” under the **Format** menu; to display correctly in Safari, you must **save your file with a name ending in .html**

## Directories/folders:

Files are stored in directories, also called “folders,” on your computer. Folders can contain other folders within them. For example:



Here, example.html is in the “student” directory (sometimes called the “Home” directory, which is different from the “/home” directory), and myPicture.jpg is in the “Documents” directory.

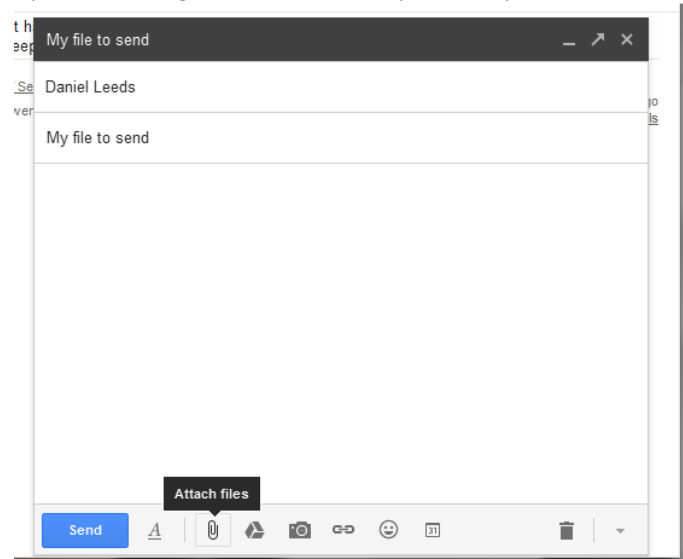
example.html is unable to use the myPicture.jpg image using the tag we learned --

`` -- because the image is in a different directory. We can use the Files program on the lab machines (and other directory browsers in Windows/Mac) to move the picture file to the same place.

## Copying files

### Using gmail

You can e-mail files to yourself using the attachment option on your e-mail.



### Using Filezilla

You can place your files on a remote computer (for example, storm.cis.fordham.edu) that you can access from anywhere.
